

## **LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM**

Seven weeks after the disciples had witnessed the resurrection of Jesus, he announced that he was returning to his Father. But Jesus promised that he would not leave them alone, he promised that he would send the Holy Spirit to be with them “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses” Acts 1:8

On the day of Pentecost, as the Holy Spirit came upon them, the lives of the disciples were transformed. They were filled with a new boldness and confidence, they travelled around preaching and teaching, and the church came into being.

Do we have that same boldness and confidence in the Gospel, in our faith? When we meet together in our churches it is a safe place to be, among friends, among those who share the same faith as us. Sometimes our Christian faith takes us outside our “comfort zone”.

Society today marginalizes Christianity, and at times there is a very clear antipathy towards the church. Where church and society meet tensions can arise.

But we cannot contain our Christian faith within the four walls of the church, Christ equips us to serve him in the world. We carry our faith with us wherever we go, our lives witness to our faith in Christ.

He gives us different gifts with which to serve him. “There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all people... to each one the Spirit is given for the common good”. 1 Corinthians 12:4-7

We are all recipients of the blessing of the Spirit of God, but there are different ways in which we serve him in the life of the church and the world. At our recent annual meetings some people were elected to serve God as churchwardens or PCC members, some have gifts of administration and some of pastoral care. Some have gifts of teaching or leading others in worship, some have a ministry of prayer. We are currently looking for people who would be willing to lead our prayers in our church services, please have a word with one of the ministry team if you would be interested.

There are many opportunities for prayer, in our homes as well as in our churches. Regular prayer is the foundation on which we build our faith, and which inspires us to greater service. This month we will be praying for God’s kingdom to come (Thy Kingdom Come – see the information in this magazine) along with our regular prayer for healing (on the second Sunday of each month) and our mission community prayer (monthly).

Your prayers are valuable, your prayers are crucial, your prayers are so important. Pray for our churches, pray for our world and our communities, and the spread of the good news of God’s love and forgiveness and healing.

### **Annual Meetings**

The Annual Meetings for the Parish of the Solway Plain will take place on **Sunday 21st May**. We will be holding a United Service at 10.00am in **Christ Church Silloth**. The Annual Meetings will take place in the Church following the service at 11.00am. (**NOTE VENUE CHANGE**)

The Annual Meeting of Parishioners will elect churchwardens for the parish churches of Christ Church Silloth, Holme St Cuthbert, Holme Cultram Abbey, St Matthew's Church Westnewton, St John's Newton Arlosh & St Bride's Kirkbride, and deputy churchwardens for St Mungo's Bromfield

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will elect the Parochial Church Council. There will be three members elected to the PCC from each church – which will include at least one churchwarden (or deputy) from each church to serve on the PCC alongside clergy, reader and licenced lay workers.

The seven churches of the Solway Plain parish each have their own local committee which looks after the day-to-day aspects of the church's life. If you would be interested in joining one of the committees, please have a word with us.

### **Electoral Roll.**

The Electoral Roll will be updated in preparation for the Annual Meetings. Forms are available in the churches and from electoral roll officers. The rolls need to be updated by 7th May, so please ensure any new forms are returned as soon as possible

### **BROMFIELD PARISH COUNCIL**

Summary of the Parish Council Meeting held at Blencogo Village Hall at 7.30pm on Thursday 30th March. Present: Cllrs G. Fellows (Chair), P. Batch, J. Lee, C. Wilson and S. Lunken. Also present: J. Lister, Cumbria County Councillor and C. Gray, Manager at the Mission House, Langrigg.

Items discussed included: Mission House, Langrigg - Concern had been raised by some residents in Langrigg regarding a recent incident and police presence at the Mission House. Calvin Gray the Registered Service Manager of Wilderness Way at The Mission House provided members with an outline of the Wilderness Way's vision to support children who are vulnerable and provide personalised care to help them recover and prepare for a positive future which at times can be challenging. Mr. Gray offered to answer any questions to reassure residents and advised that they do not envisage any future incidents such as the one that had occurred recently and will be mindful of the community in the future. Cumbria County/Allerdale Borough Council – Cllr Lister reported that arrangements are being finalised for the handover to Cumberland Council on 1st April. Cllr Lister advised he will be retiring from local government on 31st March. Members thanked Cllr Lister for his assistance with matters affecting the Parish over the last 16 years. FUL/2023/0043 – Bromfield Hall - Erection of building to house robotic milking system and cubicles with solar panel array. HOU/2023/0054 – Mereside Farm, Bromfield - Erection of stable and garage block. HOU/2023/0053 – Holly Barn, Blencogo - Proposed single storey rear extension. Decisions: FUL/2023/0010 – Langrigg House, Langrigg - New steel framed portal farm building – GRANTED.





Also present: M. Johnson, Allerdale Borough Councillor, J. Lister, Cumbria County Councillor and K. Thurlow, Cumberland Councillor. Matters discussed included: Reports from Outside Bodies: Cllr Johnson reported that the Borough Council will cease to exist as of 31st March 2023.

Arrangements are being finalised to hand over to the new Cumberland Council. Cumbria County Council – Cllr Lister reported that he will be retiring from local government at the end of March. Cllrs Johnson and Lister were thanked for their work in the Parish. Cumberland Council – the new unitary Council will come into effect on 1st April, 2023.
