LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

It doesn't seem long since the Christmas Decorations were put away for another year. The shelves in the shops were quickly emptied and filled with Easter Eggs, and chocolate Bunnies, looking ahead to the Easter Season. The dark days of winter have almost passed. As I write this letter, signs of spring are in the air, the snow drops are blossoming, and the daffodils are not far behind. As Lent comes to an end we look ahead to spring and summer. There have been some wonderful sunny days, despite it being often cold and wet. Darkness has passed, light and life are ahead.

Words often attributed to St. Augustine of Hippo say "We are an Easter people". The Christian faith is founded on the glory of the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. The death of Jesus Christ was not unusual, although he died having committed no crime, a miscarriage of justice. Many people throughout history have died at the hands of others, and their teaching and example have lasted throughout the centuries.

What marks out the Christian faith is that; not only do we recognise the great sacrifice of Jesus Christ made on the cross which demonstrated the incredible love of God for his people, a love which brings with it forgiveness, the righting of wrongs and reconciliation with God. We put our trust in the God who raised Jesus to life again.

This is not simply an acknowledgement of an historical truth, attested to by witnesses at the time, and recorded in the gospels and other writings of the time. Being an Easter people is the realisation that resurrection is part of our experience in life. We live in the light of God's love, in knowing that we are forgiven, that death has been overcome, and that life in all its fulness is ours to share.

In our world today, people live without hope, their lives are defined by cynicism, they fear the future. But the Easter faith brings hope out of fear, life out of death, joy out of pain, love out of hatred. Often this seems too fanciful as we continue with our earthly struggles. But our hope is the one who came among us, who shared in the pains of our earthly existence that we may share in the glory of his heavenly kingdom of love, joy and peace.

This is the good news we celebrate at Easter, this is the good news that we have to share.

Summary of the Meeting held at Blencogo Village Hall at 7.30pm on Thursday 25th January, 2024.

Present: Cllrs. I. Brough, R. Davison, J. Lee, S. Lunken, and M. Underwood (Chair). Also Present: K. Thurlow Cumberland Councillor, G. Bickley Village Hall Committee and one member of the public.

Matters discussed included: Planning applications received:

FUL/2023/0265 - Oakhurst Barn, Leegate Farm, Waverton - Change of use of land to domestic and erection of new storage shed

Decisions: HOU/2023/0183 - Holly Barn, Blencogo - Re-submission of application HOU/2023/0053 for a proposed single storey extension and the insertion of roof light into main dwelling – GRANTED.

Village Hall – Members were provided with an update on the activities held at the village hall over the recent months and events planned for the coming year. Dog Fouling – Members noted that incidents of dog fouling are still occurring. Residents should report any incidents of dog fouling to Cumberland Council. Service for Christian Unity

18th to 24th January was a week devoted by churches around the world to pray for Christian Unity. Our churches met on Sunday 21st for a united service in the Roman Catholic church. Members of different churches in Silloth contributed to the worship which was led by Rev Bryan.

RNLI 200th Anniversary

2024 marks the 200th Anniversary of the founding of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution. The first purpose-built lifeboat was designed and patented in 1785. In 1824 the vision to have a service dedicated to saving lives at sea became a reality on 4th March. Over the past 200 years there have been many acts of bravery, many lives saved, and many notable people who have dedicated themselves to saving lives at sea. One of the most famous is Grace Darling became a national heroine after risking her life to save the stranded survivors of the wrecked steamship Forfarshire in 1838.

There are now 238 lifeboat stations around our coastline, manned by incredible volunteers and supported by donations from the public. Silloth Lifeboat station was established in 1860 and now operates from the new boathouse which replaced the original Victorian lifeboat station. It was opened in 1995

We are for ever grateful to the volunteer lifeboat crew, fundraisers and supporters who continue to give so much of their time to saving lives and ensuring the safety of all along our beautiful coastline.

In 1956 four men, Joseph Bell, Stanley Graham, John Johnstone and Alexander Black Ramsay lost their lives when a fire service rescue boat overturned whilst trying to save a man stranded in Skinburness Marsh.

A service to mark the 200th Anniversary of the RNLI will be held in Christ Church, Silloth at 3pm on Sunday 24th March. Please join us as we mark this significant milestone in the ongoing work of the RNLI.
