Flying for life - Mission Aviation Fellowship

Serving the isolated

'Imagine if your community had no roads and little access to the outside world. How would you or your family reach a doctor if you were sick or injured? How would you receive an education or access job opportunities? This is the reality for millions of people. Jungles, mountains, swamps, insecurity and dilapidated infrastructure are all barriers to receiving physical and spiritual care and a hope for the future.'

This quote is from Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) a Christian organization that provides aviation, communications, and learning technology services to more than 1,400 Christian and humanitarian agencies, as well as thousands of isolated missionaries and indigenous villagers in the world's most remote areas. There are three major operational centers – Nampa, Idaho, United States, Ashford, United Kingdom, and Cairns, Australia. These centers provide operational support to programs in the Americas, Africa and Asia Pacific regions. Mission Aviation Fellowship is the world's largest humanitarian air operator. For over 75 years they have been flying light aircraft over jungles, mountains, swamps and deserts, to bring medical care, emergency relief and long-term development. Their pilots and personnel deliver relief workers, doctors, pastors, school books, food, medicines - everything that can only be safely and speedily delivered by air. Their faithful supporters give and pray to make this all possible.

FOUR HOURS NOT FOUR DAYS

Thanks to MAF, three year old Ojiya from Juba, South Sudan avoided a four day road trip for a life-saving operation in Nairobi. She was born with a hole in her stomach, following complex reconstructive surgery the little girl recovered fully in hospital. Wherever there is need Christian organisations find a way of serving God. It comes as a result of our Lord's teaching to care for the poor and needy. Matthews gospel has this: 'For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' Matt 25:35-36.

Christians have always answered the call to serve others. They do that because God gives hope to all mankind through the resurrection of his Son at Easter. Christian hope for the next life gives hope for this life. The reason Christians help the poor is because they are motivated to proclaim the kingdom of God, which is the good news that Jesus is lord. Christians believe that works of compassion are directed by God to heal the nations and bring hope to all mankind. A new heaven and a new earth await. This good news gives freedom to the oppressed, because the oppressed know that the oppressor will not always operate. Christians are commanded to visit the 'widow and the orphan' in their distress. Christians must also heed the warning of Jesus in Matthew 25 about not neglecting the poor. "I never knew you," he says to those who neglected the poor.

It is remarkable, then, how the atonement of Christ compels us to help the poor; for God entered our world and suffered, and so too, we are called to enter the world of the poor and show them the compassion of Jesus.

'Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your deeds from before my eyes; cease to do evil, learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression; bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause' (Isaiah 1:16-17).

As many of you may already know we have an amazing opportunity to purchase Blencogo Village Hall from the Diocese of Carlisle. The Village Hall committee is very keen that we make this happen. At present the rent on the hall costs around 10% of the hall's annual income. If we can purchase the hall then we can save that money and invest it in the community and in the hall's future. That money would help us to build up a resilience fund for the hall and it would help us to put on more community events without having to worry about breaking even every time. Purchasing the hall would also free up more grant application avenues in the future and make applying for grants simpler. This in turn would help us to look at making improvements to the hall such as solar panels, new heating sources etc all of which will help the hall to become more environmentally friendly but also help us to cut costs, further protecting the future of the hall. The Hall is one of only two community assets left within Bromfield Parish, the other being the excellent Grey Hound Inn. We're determined to do everything we can to ensure the future of this important asset and we feel that the best way to do that is through the Village Hall Charity owning the Hall.

Please do consider helping us out. If every household in the parish could donate £100 over the next twelve months that would be almost half of the purchase price. If you can support our fundraising events please do so you'll find details of two in this month's parish magazine. Staff update

We are delighted to have welcomed two new registrars, bringing with them experience from working in other general practices and different clinical backgrounds. Dr Belema Osigbo and Dr Shweta Ajay will be here until August.

Triaging appointments

As most patients are aware, the GPs have requested that our reception team ask for the reason for your appointment. This is to ensure all appointments are triaged and everyone is seen in the correct timeframe, and by the correct clinician. All information given will always be treated in confidence

New Door

A new electric opening front door has been installed. This has given us a wider opening into the building and once it is working properly will aid access for patients with mobility difficulties.

Extended Access for Appointments

We can now book our patients in with nurses at Wigton hospital on Saturdays for many routine checks and tests. This service is helpful if you struggle to get to the practice Monday-Friday during our office hours. Ask our receptionist when you make a booking.

Questionnaires

We are trying to update patient records; with the use of NHS approved digital systems. The most efficient way of gathering information we need for monitoring patient health is to use questionnaires- and these may be sent by text or email. If you receive a message from us asking for health information we'd be really grateful if you would reply. With over 3000 patients to care for it really helps us to get the information we require quickly and efficiently. Once your records are updated we can then offer appropriate services where they are needed.

Pharmacy First

This is a new national NHS service which will run alongside the pharmacy minor ailments scheme. Many conditions do not require a GP to advise or treat.

The 7 conditions being triaged this way are

Sinusitis 12 years and older; Infected insect bites, 1 year and over;
earache (children 1-17 years; sore throat 5 years and over;
impetigo 1 year and over; shingles over 18 years only; UTI women 16-64 years
Our receptionists are trained to triage in this way and will ask about symptoms when you ring about appointments.

Pharmacists can prescribe or offer other treatment suggestions for a range of conditions and we can refer you to a pharmacist who can offer you an appointment when we might not have availability.

By using this system we can all help to make sure that a GP appointment is available for you when you really need it urgently.

Consult with your doctor online

To miss the wait on the phones, you can now request an appointment on our website.

www.kirkbridesurgery.org.uk. Your request will be triaged within 72 hours, and a member of the admin team or a GP will get back to you. This should not be used for any urgent Matters. You can scan this QR code with the camera on your phone to take you to the right place to leave your query!

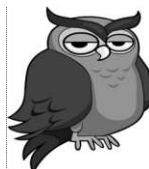
