LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Dear Friends,

It has been a great joy to share in these last few months and in a small way with the ministry of the Solway Plain churches. Thank you for your welcome, and the unfailing way in which the churches sustain their life and work week by week. For so many years as a vicar of one and then two churches, I had far less opportunity than I do now of experiencing the variety of our church and parish life. It has been one of the joys of retirement to visit so many churches and be part of their life. As I write this contribution for the May magazine, we are in the early stages of the Easter season. This continues from Easter Sunday right up to the Ascension, and then until Pentecost or Whitsunday, which this year is on Sunday 19th May.

In a sense the church year divides neatly into two halves. From Advent until Pentecost we reflect over six months on 'What do we believe today, from the foundations of the life of Jesus as we find it in the New Testament'. Then, for the next six months, beginning at the end of May, we are asked: 'How then shall we live as Christians, with our faith in God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit'. This will take us through the season of the Sundays after Trinity and covers half the year. These questions are equally important. Just recently Professor Richard Dawkins, the Oxford scientist who is one of the best known critics of Christian faith and belief and who feels reasonably sure that there is no God, has noticed that he is a 'Cultural Christian' – one who values hymns and traditional services, who values the Christian heritage of its architecture and cathedrals, its morally serious tradition of ethics and thought about how we should live, and its major part in forming our culture. The professor is not wrong about all this. But where Professor Dawkins, the author of 'The God Delusion' (the clue is in the title) needs to do more work, is in reflecting how Christian life and culture on the one hand, and, on the other hand, what it is that Christians believe belong together in our history; and belong together just as much now. Bringing that shared Christian heritage in a living way into the future depends upon the often quite small communities who value the faith, the prayer, the teaching, the fellowship which begins with the risen Lord at Easter and continues to flow out across all the earth. Each of us has a part to play in that witness. Critics of Christianity who nevertheless love and appreciate the sort of society that the faith has nurtured and sustained are living on borrowed time. The renewal of what is good in our society and community is an exercise which has to be carried out in each fresh generation. This calls all those who count themselves among the faithful to prayer, worship, lives of holiness and witness; it equally invites everyone who thinks well of our Christian heritage to examine afresh, thoughtfully and carefully, the claims which the risen Lord, who is not dead but alive, and is Lord of the future, makes on you and on all of us.

Annual Meetings

The Annual Meetings for the Parish of the Solway Plain will take place on Sunday 19th May. We will be holding a United Service at 10.00am in Holme St Cuthbert Church. The Annual Meetings will take place in the Church following the service at 11.00am.

The Annual Meeting of Parishioners will elect churchwardens for the parish churches of Christ Church Silloth, Holme St Cuthbert, Holme Cultram Abbey, St Matthew's Church Westnewton, St John's Newton Arlosh & St Bride's Kirkbride, and deputy churchwardens for St Mungo's Bromfield

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will elect the Parochial Church Council. There will be three members elected to the PCC from each church – which will include at least one churchwarden (or deputy) from each church to serve on the PCC alongside clergy, reader and licensed lay workers.

The seven churches of the Solway Plain parish each have their own local committee which looks after the day-to-day aspects of the church's life. If you would be interested in joining one of the committees, please have a word with us.

Electoral Roll

Thy Kingdom Come Ascension to Pentecost 2024 9th - 19th May 2024

Thy Kingdom Come is a worldwide prayer movement that happens each year between Ascension Day and Pentecost Sunday.

When Jesus spoke to his disciples before ascending to heaven he promised them

'... you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses ... to the ends of the earth.' (Acts 1:8)

Those first followers responded to this promise by constantly devoting themselves to prayer (Acts 1:14), day after day, until the Holy Spirit came upon them in power.

These precious days between Ascension and Pentecost can, for us too, be infused with expectation and anticipation.
