LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Hello at Harvest time.

Did you know that the town motto of Kendal is (in Latin) pannus mihi panis which townspeople translate as “wool is my bread”. Strictly it means “CLOTH is my bread” and it refers to the fact that, in the middle ages, the chief trade of Kendal was weaving and selling woolen cloth, especially cloth dyed “Kendal Green” which is mentioned in Shakespeare’s “Henry IV” pt 1.

The point is that the money earned from the wool put bread on the tables of the Kendal workers. It was the basis of their lives.

And bread, of course is the staple food, the basis of life for people in the Western World and for the Middle East. It was the basis of life for Jesus and his disciples and he taught them (and us) to pray to God for our daily bread. It’s the only material thing we’re directed to ask for when we say the Lord’s prayer. Our other requests are for the more heavenly gifts that we call God’s Grace. We ask Him to forgive our wickedness and protect us from going our own way and being more wicked.

Before asking for anything in that prayer, we praise God in His heaven and hope that His creation will work out as He wants it. Finally we put ourselves into His hands because only He is in charge, only He can make things happen and only He is glorious.

At this Harvest time we think especially of our bread and all the rich variety of food and drink we enjoy. We can savor it and treasure it. We can thank God joyfully – singing and praising him together and actually eating and sharing His gifts together. We can recognize how especially favored we in our community are and take thought – and action – for those without even the most basic of foods.

This year our Bishop’s Harvest Appeal will see money collected for a Christian Aid project in the west African country of Burkina Faso to help promote training around the production of an organic fertilizer to boost harvests. We can take time too at Harvest to think about how we depend on each other in life. Give thanks for those who work to provide food. Their lives are regulated by the forces of Nature and they must work whenever the seasons and the weather dictate. The night before I wrote this I drove home past more than one tractor still out in the pitch dark.

As for life after Harvest Thanksgiving, we can go forward marveling at how much God gives us. How much He must love us. If we remember that, we can trust Him whatever comes our way.

I quoted Kendal’s civic motto. The motto of Carlisle is “Be just and fear not”. The phrase “Fear not” or “Don’t be afraid” is said to occur 365 times in the bible. Something to remember every day.

Over the last four years, nearly £85,000 has been raised for our partner projects with Christian Aid and the Mothers' Union in Israel, Palestine and the Democratic Republic of Congo. This work has made a real difference in people's lives.

This year sees the start of a new cycle of fundraising, in support of Christian Aid's work in Burkina Faso and that of the Church Mission Society in Northern Argentina – one of our link dioceses. Two local groups – Cumbria Development Education Centre and Carlisle One World Centre – will also benefit.

I'm excited to see how this missional work will play out over the next three years as we again commit to the support of our brothers and sisters in Christ in the wider communion.

I pray that lives will again be transformed through these partnerships and that levels of giving will continue to grow.



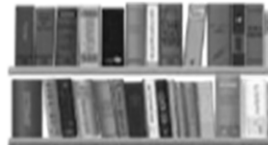

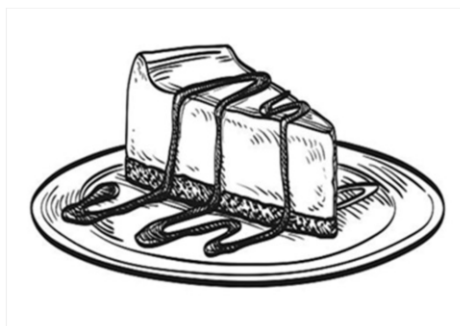
From the Library
